Shall be the joy of all the earth."




Response of the believing heart (right side of church):



Benediction:





God promises to faithful Abraham that through his offspring all the nations of the earth will be blessed.


Hymn: Come, Your Heart and Voices Raising

EIGHTH LESSON: Luke 2:1-14

St. Luke tells of the birth of Jesus.

Pastor: And it came to pass in those days that a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This census first took place while Quirinius was governing Syria. So all went to be registered, everyone to his own city.

Men: Joseph also went up from Galilee, out of the city of Nazareth, into Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed wife, who was with child.

Women: So it was, that while they were there, the days were completed for her to be delivered. And she brought forth her firstborn Son, and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn.


Pastor: Now there were in the same country shepherds living out in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. And behold, an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were greatly afraid.

C: proclaim his salvation day after day.


P: Say among the nations, "The LORD reigns."
