C: We hear the message proclaimed of Christ crucified.


Hymn 907: God Himself Is Present

Old Testament lesson:

Exodus 20:1-17....God's commandments are holy and good. Yet they cannot save, because we cannot kept them.

And God spoke all these words, saying, "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.

"You shall have no other gods before me.

"You shall not murder.

"You shall not commit adultery.

"You shall not steal.

"You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

"You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's."

Epistle lesson:

1 Corinthians 1:22-25....The "foolishness" of the cross is God's wisdom for our eternal salvation.

For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

Nicene Creed


His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for your house will consume me." So the Jews said to him, "What sign do you show us for doing these things?"

General Fund – January receipts: **\$136,368 VS** disbursements: **\$115,330.** The General Fund subsidizes the work of the Boards of Missions, Trustees, EdPub, & Regents (including ILC.)

ILC Operations - January receipts: \$187,905 VS disbursements: \$126,056.

IIF - January receipts: \$4,191 VS disbursements: \$315.

ILC Building Projects – January receipts: \$29,662 (including an \$13,263 increase in market value of investments) VS disbursements: None.

MDF - January receipts: \$47,458 VS disbursements: \$21,556.

Kinship – January receipts: \$32,086 VS disbursements: \$31,505 (including \$13,000 for disaster relief).

CEF – January receipts: \$51,960 (including a \$27,427 increase in market value of investments) VS disbursements: \$4,092 (mostly payments on member loans to the CEF).

SAF - January receipts: \$10,403 VS disbursements: \$11,526 (including student loans, grants, scholarships and tuition assistance).

Reserve Fund is currently invested in a money market account until needed, typically each fiscal yearend.

EduK8 Fund - January receipts: \$1,862. Balance \$37,109.
