

#### Old Testament lesson: Job 38:1-11





#### Epistle lesson: 2 Corinthians 5:14-21

For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised.

From now on, therefore, we regard no one according to the flesh. Even though we once regarded Christ according to the flesh, we regard him thus no longer. Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God."

### Congregational finances

May offerings were \$2,856 below budgeted needs, and the balance of available funds decreased by \$6,608. For the fiscal year which ends at the end of June, offerings are \$34,354 under budgeted needs, and the balance of available funds has decreased by \$21,252. For several months offerings were keeping pace with the budget, but recently there has been a shortfall. May the Lord provide us with the means and the generous hearts to support his work among us. It is good to remember, too, that even when vacations take us away from a Sunday service, the weekly expenses are still there.
