



### **Greeting and prayer:** (Pastor)

During our Wednesday Advent worship services we examined some of the titles given to Jesus in Isaiah 9:6—Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, and Prince of Peace. We looked at how each of these titles describes something about *who* Jesus is and *what* He did for our salvation.

Today we continue our Christmas celebration by looking at the fourth and final title from Isaiah 9:6: "Prince of Peace." In this world we long for peace, but we fail to obtain it. True peace only comes through Jesus Christ, the Great Gift that came to us in the flesh at Christmas. He alone offers us true and lasting peace. Therefore, Jesus is given the title "Prince of Peace." He rules over creation and gives us peace with God through His sacrifice on the cross for us. As a result, we, His believers are also able to be at peace with each other.

We pray that the Holy Spirit would bless our worship and study of His Word, and so, we begin our worship service with prayer...

### **Confession and Absolution**


We come before our Holy God recognizing that we are sinful and daily need His forgiveness.

<sup>14</sup> The Word became flesh and dwelled among us. We have seen his glory, the glory he has as the only-begotten from the Father, full of grace and truth. <sup>15</sup> John testified about him. He cried out, "This was the one I spoke about when I said, 'The one coming after me outranks me because he existed before me.'" <sup>16</sup> For out of his fullness we have all received grace upon grace. <sup>17</sup> For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ. <sup>18</sup> No one has ever seen God. The only-begotten Son, who is close to the Father's side, has made him known.

## **Second Reading**

Luke 2:22-40 (EHV)

**P** The second reading is from Luke 2:22-40.

## Sanctify us by Your truth, O LORD. Your Word is truth!

<sup>22</sup> When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, they [Mary & Joseph] brought him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. <sup>23</sup> (As it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every firstborn male will be called holy to the Lord.") <sup>24</sup> And they came to offer a sacrifice according to what was said in the law of the Lord, "A pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons." <sup>25</sup> Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, waiting for the comfort of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. <sup>26</sup> It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. <sup>27</sup> Moved by the Spirit he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what was customary according to the law, <sup>28</sup> Simeon took him into his arms and praised God. He said,

- <sup>29</sup> Lord, you now dismiss your servant in peace, according to your word,
- <sup>30</sup> because my eyes have seen your salvation,
- <sup>31</sup> which you have prepared before the face of all people,
- <sup>32</sup> a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel.
- <sup>33</sup> Joseph and the child's mother were amazed at the things that were spoken about him. <sup>34</sup> Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Listen carefully, this child is appointed for the falling and rising of many in Israel and for a sign that is spoken against, <sup>35</sup> so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed. And a sword will pierce your own soul too."

<sup>36</sup> Anna, a prophetess, was there. She was a daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was very old. She had lived with her husband for seven years after her marriage, <sup>37</sup> and then she was a widow of eighty-four years. She did not leave the temple complex, since she was worshipping with fasting and prayers night and day. <sup>38</sup> Standing nearby at that very hour, she

gave thanks to the Lord. She kept speaking about the child to all who were waiting for the redemption of Jerusalem.

<sup>39</sup> When they had accomplished everything according to the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town, Nazareth. <sup>40</sup> The child grew and became strong. He was filled with wisdom, and God's favor was on him.
