


We invoke ("call upon") the name of the one true God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Sanctify us by Your truth, O LORD. Your Word is truth!


¹⁵ The people were waiting expectantly and were all wondering in their hearts if John might be the Christ. ¹⁶ John answered them all, "I baptize you with water. But someone mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to untie the strap of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing shovel is in his hand, and he will thoroughly clean out his threshing floor. He will gather the wheat into his barn, but he will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire."

¹⁸ Then with many other words, he appealed to them and was preaching good news to the people. ¹⁹ But after John rebuked Herod the tetrarch because of Herodias, his brother's wife, and because of all the evil things he had done— ²⁰ Herod added this to them all: He locked John in prison.

²¹ When all the people were being baptized, Jesus was baptized too. While he was praying, heaven was opened, ²² and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love. I am well pleased with you."

Sermon Text: John 2:1-11 (EHV)

Three days later, there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee. Jesus' mother was there. ² Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. ³ When the wine was gone, Jesus' mother said to him, "They have no wine." ⁴ Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does that have to do with you and me? My time has not come yet." ⁵ His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." ⁶ Six stone water jars, which the Jews used for ceremonial cleansing, were standing there, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. ⁷ Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. ⁸ Then he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the banquet." And they did.

⁹When the master of the banquet tasted the water that had now become wine, he did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew). The master of the banquet called the bridegroom ¹⁰ and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when the guests have had plenty to drink, then the cheaper wine. You saved the good wine until now!" ¹¹ This, the beginning of his miraculous signs, Jesus performed in Cana of Galilee. He revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him.

Sermon Theme: Jesus' "Little" Miracles

⊕ Even though Jesus' first miracle seemed rather "unimpressive" compared to some of His other miracles, how do we see Jesus' true glory in this "little" miracle?

<u>Application</u>: Can you think of some of the "little" miracles God performs in our everyday lives that show His <u>greatness</u> and personal love for each one of us?

Pay close attention and look out for these "little" miracles as you go about your week.



General Fund – In the month of December we received about \$28,000 more than we spent. This reduced the deficit in the fund to just over of \$83,000 compared to a year ago when it we had a deficit of under \$19,000. Contributions through December are down about \$36,000 compared to last year at this time.

ILC Operations – Revenue is up about \$63,000 over the same period as last year while disbursements are up about \$14,000.

ILC Building Projects – Year-to-date contributions have been about \$188,000. December brought a decline in the market value of the investments in this fund but there is still a positive increase in market value of approximately \$80,000 for the year.

Church Extension Fund – Year to date revenue consists of payments received of almost \$137,000 from congregations on the loans they owe the CLC, about \$131,000 of increases in the market value of the investments and just under \$1,000 of contributions to the fund. Expenditures in December included a loan of \$150,000 to a congregation

Other Auxiliary Funds – The activity in the other funds in the table above is similar to the activity in the same period a year ago.
